Dear Mr. Rowan,

I would like to thank yourself, the Hamlet council, and the community members for meeting with myself and the other project representatives and participating in the information session and discussions on the wind resource assessment project on March 23, 2017.

During the community meeting, there were a few items which was requested of us to follow up on. Please share the following information with the community members regarding these requests.

One of the questions during the community meeting was why the meeting participants were required to sign in. It was explained that this project is required to go through the Nunavut Impact Review Board's (NIRB) screening process and as part of this, the NIRB requires a community engagement report. Provided with this letter is NIRB's "Proponent Guide to Conducting Public Consultation" and highlighted is their general requirements for public engagements-including record of the names of participating individuals.

Further questions were regarding if any comments were received during NIRB's public comment period. Provided is the NIRB's "Screening Decision Report" which outlines the comments received. To summarize, there were no comments from the public, INAC had no comments and Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) had the following comment:

- There are potential risks to migratory birds from the installation of the guyed meteorological tower; however, they noted that the Hunters and Trappers Association provided recommendations to the Proponent on the preferred locations to minimize impacts to wildlife, and specifically to birds and therefore they had no concerns at this time.

All information the NIRB receives and distributes on proposed projects is public information and can be found on NIRB's public FTP site should anyone be interested.
