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Hi Phyllis,

In compliance with Part G, Items 4 & 5, you will find attached the signed drawings for the bridge and for culverts 7a. Essentially, to date we have provided drawings for culverts 2a, 3a, 5, 9, 10 and 11. There are no culverts installed at crossing 2, 3, 4, and 6. As mentioned in the annual report from last year, we did some rehabilitation of the streams at crossings 2 and 3, to restore the flow as requested by DFO. No work was done at crossing 4 and 6 during the project. Finally, note that at crossings 9, 10, and 11, the culverts were removed at the end of the clean up projects in October 2010, and the streams were reopened.

Finally, we anticipate returning in the summer of 2011 to conduct mitigation work, and to remove culverts at crossings 7a, 5, 3a and 2a.
