Hi Mrs. Walker,

I've just read your comments about our water license application.

We will consider all the recommendations that you made for our project in Pond Inlet. In the following email, I will comment your three recommendations and attach all the necessary documents.

Construction Work Plan:

-

1. Our construction work plan specifies all the activities that will occur during the project. The water license application has been made for watercourses crossing during the haul road construction. For the culverts that will be installed, coarse materials will be used at the entrance and exit of the culverts. For the other erosion and sediments measures (silt fences, water pools), please refer to the attached quarry management plan.
2. The second concern about migratory bird is part of our CEMP (Construction environmental management plan) which the interesting parts are attached to this email. Our works are supposed to begin mid-august because of sealift dates so we will be out of the range for nesting. Moreover a biologist or an environmental monitor will be on site prior the beginning of works to identify if there is any species on construction areas.
3. About the dredging materials, it will be used in totality to fill the laydown area.

### 3.7.2 Find

There are several prohibited activities (activities listed in Acts and Regulations that include, but are not limited to):
