The Proponent intends to conduct hydrological and sediment sampling in the Greiner Lake watershed. The program is proposed to take place from April 1 to October 31, 2016 The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Installation and Operation of River Gauging Stations
- Maintenance of River Gauging Stations
- Measurement of Stream Flow
- Transportations of personnel, instruments and associated materials
