Re: Notice of Part 4 Screening for Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada's "High Arctic Remediation" project proposal

Dear Mark Yetman:

On June 4, 2015 the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB or Board) received Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada's (AANDC) "High Arctic Remediation" project proposal from AANDC. On June 15, 2015 the NIRB received a positive conformity determination (North Baffin Region Land Use Plan) from the Nunavut Planning Commission. The NIRB has assigned this project proposal file number 15UN034 - please reference this file number in related future correspondence.

The proposed site remediation project is located across six sites in the North Baffin Region, all within 500 kilometres of Resolute Bay or Grise Fiord. The sites were contaminated as a result of oil and gas exploration activities; in the summer 2015 field season, Phase III Environment Site Assessment work will be conducted at all six sites. The program is proposed to take place from July 1 to September 30, 2015.

The proposed project activities include:

- Transportation of up to 20 people to and from the base camp at Rea Point via fixed wing aircraft;
- Establishment of a tent base camp for up to 20 people at Rea Point, including:
 - Storage of 5330 litres of diesel, 23 575 litres of aviation fuel, and 2300 pounds of propane in berms on-site;
 - o Use of approximately cubic metre of water per day from a local water source;
 - o Incineration of all solid waste on site;
 - Use of a sump to dispose of greywater;
- Transportation from Rea Point to the other five sites via helicopter or fixed wing aircraft;

- Collection of soil and water samples from all six sites, including:
 - o Collection of up to 66 ground water and 63 surface water samples;
 - o Collection of up to 728 soil and 51 sediment samples;
 - o Collection of hazardous materials samples from barrel liquids and building materials such as asbestos and paint for chemical analysis; and
 - o Transportation of samples to Ottawa for laboratory analysis; and
- Potential for geotechnical work if deemed necessary in the field, including collection of bulk samples of potential borrow source materials in areas where site remediation is anticipated based on results of Phase I and II environmental site assessments.

The NIRB would like parties to provide comments regarding:

- Whether the project proposal is likely to arouse significant public concern; and if so, why;
- Whether the project proposal is likely to cause significant adverse eco-systemic and socio-economic effects; and if so, why;
- Whether the project is of a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and mitigable with known technology, (please provide any recommended mitigation measures); and
- Any matter of importance to the Party related to the project proposal.
