Hi Phyllis,

Please find attached an application form for a NU Water License, as we discussed by telephone earlier today. I was unable to fill in question 8 on the application, but here is a brief description of water/waste handling at our camp on Baffin Island:

The camp is occupied seasonally by up to 6 people for a period of about 15 days per year. Water is drawn by bucket from Netilling Lake during that time, for drinking and washing dishes (approximately 5-10 gallons per day). All sewage is buried on site (outhouse), and most garbage is burned in an incinerator (45 gallon drum with a screen on top). Items that cannot be burned are removed to Iqaluit, where they are taken to the town landfill. Over the years, most of the bulky scrap items around the camp have been removed to Iqaluit (e.g., empty fuel drums, partly filled drums, broken outboards, nets, etc from previous users). Gray water from dishes is filtered and discarded in a latrine pit; filtered items are burned.
