## Non-Technical Project Summary - English

In 2015, Arctic Kingdom set up a base camp in Navy Board inlet to support a filming expedition, for which a permit was obtained under the project name "Pristine Seas". The location was excellent for wildlife viewing, observing the floe edge and its summer break up and its proximity to other sites in the Lancaster Sound region. We would like to continue to obtain an annual permit to set up a temporary camp in this area to be able to cater to high end tourist groups who want private expeditions involving sightseeing by aircraft. The camp set up and crew would be very similar to the project conducted in 2015.

A temporary camp would be made up of portable tents set up on land on the northwest shore of Navy Board Inlet, near the community of Pond Inlet. To facilitate transportation and location scouting, a helicopter, single otter and/or twin otter may be chartered. In addition, snowmobiles, ATVs and/or a Zodiac may be used for land and water transportation of passengers and equipment and to facilitate sightseeing and wildlife watching. Arctic Kingdom will be providing all of the support for such an expedition, which will include remote camp set up, maintenance and break down; meals and transportation; and guidance and regional knowledge. The main goal is to view the wildlife and scenery in the area, but could also include visiting cultural and historical sites in the vicinity. Various modes of transportation will be used to scout for locations and then transfer people and gear to areas where they want to conduct their activities. Activities may include wildlife viewing, photography, videography, hiking, snorkeling, scuba diving, boating and flightseeing. As with all of Arctic Kingdom operations, this project will be conducted with the cooperation and support from nearby communities by hiring guides, bear monitors and other personnel as needed, as well as purchasing food, fuel and other necessary goods and services from local stores and businesses.
