Re.: Boart Longyear Canada Application for an Approval Without a Licence

Further the Nunavut Impact Review Board's Screening Decision Report (June 30, 2017), Boart Longyear wishes to apply for an Approval Without a Licence from the Nunavut Water Board to conduct the Roche Bay Drill Demobilization Program (refer to attached application form and translated program summary).

Boart Longyear is planning to remove our drills and drilling-related equipment from the Roche Bay and Tuktu camp areas, about 60 km west and southwest of Hall Beach. The previous operator, Advanced Explorations, has abandoned the site; our equipment that was in use on site when the property was abandoned remains in place. We would like to remove this equipment to ensure no lasting environmental effects associated with its storage.

To do this work, we plan to access the site in August 2017 for 2 weeks. We plan to set up a small, temporary camp, and will be collecting our equipment using a helicopter. Two pieces of equipment are too large to fly, so we plan to move these overland along an existing trail. We plan to store the equipment in sea cans, and the sea cans will then be removed during the next sealift.

An approval without a licence is required to use up to 20 m³/day of water for domestic purposes, and to dispose of greywater and sewage to the tundra.

Further, this letter authorizes Sharleen Hamm of Sharleen Hamm Consulting Ltd. to act as Boart Longyear's representative with regards to the enclosed application and associated licencing and reporting requirements.
