Dear Chairperson and Board Members,

We are writing to verify that Arctic Kingdom has been contracted by a small, Canadian film company to handle the logistics for a film project at Axel Heiberg in July of 2017. We will work as the liaison with the HTO and Hamlet of Grise Fiord to ensure that all logistics are being respected as specified by the community and the required permits.

Arctic Kingdom was approached to support the film project due to our current operations, equipment and local support network within the high Arctic. The area of Axel Heiberg was selected as a film site due to its remote and rare beauty. The project will focus on the mountain bike riders, staying away from wildlife or protected land. Our minimalistic camp will be set up to have low impact on the land and 100% of everything (food and human waste) will be brought off the land and disposed of in a community at the proper facilities.

We are currently in the process of obtaining all the necessary permits. Part of the permit process is that we would like to include a letter of support from the HTO and the Hamlet. Below is the overview of the project. Kindly let me know what additional information or conversations you would require.

Trip Name: Freeride Entertainment Film Project

Trip Description: A small film group and mountain bike riders will set up a light-weight camp on Axel Heiberg. Arctic Kingdom will have experienced staff to oversee the project and ensure all permit requirements and community regulations are being adhered to. Escorted by an Expedition Leader, Camp Manager, and experienced local (Grise Fiord) Inuit guide (to accompany crew in the helicopter to ensure they are avoiding any wildlife impact), and Camp Cook, the camp will provide a base while the crew films during the day. The riding ground will be on Crown land (not on Inuit Owned Land – although we are in the process of obtaining IOL permission). The crew is made up of Canadian film makers, with the final goal being to capture great mountain biking in amongst the backdrop of the stunning beauty of the 'top of the world'.

Summary of activity and impact:

- The dates for the trip are July 5 August 2, 2017
