RE: NPC File # 151030 [Phase 1: Managing climate risks to living heritage at Talluruti (Morin Point), Nunavut]

The following works and activities have been proposed in the above-noted project proposal:

1. **Primary Land Use:** Archaeological Research
2. **Project summary description:** Management of current damage to Early Inuit house due to coastal erosion, documenting and collection of artifacts from damaged areas. Use of drone technology to map the site and document permafrost.
3. **Associated NPC File No.:** 150760
4. **Location:** Qikiqtani Region; [Morin Point in Talluruti]

The NPC has completed its review of the above-noted project proposal and has determined that it conforms to the North Baffin Regional Land Use Plan (NBRLUP). The proponent has undertaken to comply with the applicable conformity requirements of Appendices C, H, and I of the NBRLUP.

The activities associated with this proposal were previously reviewed by NPC, and a conformity determination was issued on April 14, 2025 which still applies. The project proposal does not require screening by the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) because it belongs to a class of works or activities set out in Schedule 12-1 (item 2) of the Nunavut Agreement and an Exemption Agreement between the NIRB and the Department of Culture and Heritage (GN-CH) pursuant to Schedule 12-1 (item 7) of the Nunavut Agreement, and the NPC does not have concerns regarding the cumulative impacts of the project proposal.

By way of this letter, the NPC is forwarding the project proposal to the regulatory authorities identified by the proponent. Project materials, including the applicable conformity requirements, are available at the following address:

The regulatory authorities to which this letter is addressed are responsible under the *Nunavut Planning and Project Assessment Act (NuPPAA)* to implement any of the applicable requirements by incorporating the requirements directly, or otherwise ensuring that they must be met, in the terms and conditions of any authorizations issued.

This conformity determination applies only to the above noted project proposal as submitted. Proponents may not carry out projects and regulatory authorities may not issue licenses, permits and other authorizations in respect of projects if a review by the NPC is required. Regulatory authorities may consult with the NPC to obtain recommendations on their duties to implement the existing land use plans prior to issuing licenses, permits and other authorizations under subsection 69(6) of the *NuPPAA*.
