Hi Malcolm,

Long Island, South of Sanikiluag is outside the "Nunavut Settlement Area" where the NPC has jurisdiction.

Unfortunately, I'm not entirely sure what process you'll need to follow in that area, except that you don't need to submit anything to the NPC (Although Long Island is within the territory of Nunavut, it's not with the Nunavut Settlement Area where we have jurisdiction, but it is within the area covered by the Nunavik Inuit Land Claims Agreement in Quebec). If you're stuck on how to proceed, let me know and I can look into this further.
