Ms. Ida Porter,

I am requesting approval on behalf of Market Road Films for the use of water and deposit of waste without a licence in the Nansen and Eureka Sounds Watershed and the Greely Fiord Watershed. We will be filming a four-part documentary miniseries for National Geographic about arctic wolves on Ellesmere Island over a period of four months in 2018 (mid-May to mid-September) and one month in 2019 (mid-February to mid-March). We will collect freshwater from streams and ponds for the crew's drinking water. Equipment used includes a container for water collection, a membrane for water filtration, and a stove for boiling microbacteria. We estimate water use at 0.038m^3 per day, for a total of 5.7m^3 used for the entire project. Grey water waste will be spread over a large area for evaporation. Human waste will be deposited in a latrine pit, to be built at least 30m from the nearest water source and at least 2m above groundwater level. We estimate total amount of waste generated (grey water and human waste combined) at 5.68m^3 for the whole project.
