Tks for getting back to me Phyllis.

We believe our products which would be described as beer created from the pristine waters of the Sylvia Grinnell River would provide a better storyline and sales pitch than using The City Reserve water and many other breweries use. And there are chemicals that would have to be removed from City water before we could use that product. Actually, we may use city water for cleaning equipment but use the river water to actually make the beer. Its takes about 4 litres of water to make 1 liter of beer, again most of that is used for cleaning.

As for disposal, we are looking at in house treatment and final disposal in the local sewage lagoon here.

Since the Sylvia Grinnell would be considered inland water, then jurisdication would come under the NWB. We can talk more about this over the course of the next couple of months. No production is anticipated for another 15 months or so.

Hi Phyllis, I found your contact info on line. I am representing a group of investors who were recently granted a permit to construct a brewery in Iqlauit. As part of our business plan we are exploring the possibility of using the water from the Sylvia Grinnell River in Iqaluit as a source of water for products.

As I read online, a license is not required if the useage is less than 50m3 of water per day. However there are certain information that will need to be provided in order for the NWB to consider the application.

At this time we envision using about 3m3 of water per day on average. The river would be accessed by truck and the water pumped into storage tanks for removal to the brewery, perhaps once or twice a month.

Can you tell me how we go about formally making the application and what information will need to be provided.

We are in no rush for this but thought we could at least determine what is required on our end.
